following were decently interred, the Remains of ESEK BROWN, Efti in the 94th Year of his Age. During a long and painful Illneis, his Prayer to God was, that he might er joy the proper Exercise of his Reason, maintain under his Diftress a true Christian Magnanimity and Patience, and that God would grant him a comfortable Passage from this, to a Life of Bleffedness above; in all which, his surviving Family have Reason to believe God answered his Requeits. He has left, to mourn his Lofs, a disconfolate Widow, with whom he had lived 60 Years, the only Wife he ever had. He had descended from him 11 Children, 112 Grandchildren, and 127 Greatgrandchildren, in all 253, of which 201 are now living ; 73 Children and Grandchildren, of which the former are all living, attended his Funeral, and gave this Account of the Family from their own Mouths. He was more than 60 Years a regular Member of the Baptift Church, and also of the House of Commons in the Massachusetts-Bay for 14 Years; he alfo fustained several other Offices in the Town, the

Savansey, December 10, 1772. Last Friday departed this Life, and on Monday

alfo foftained feveral other Offices in the Town, the Duties of which he difchanged with great Fidelity; but amidft all his Connexions in Life, what was very remarkable, he never had an Action in Law, for or against him. The Coffin in which he was buried was made of Black Cherry-Tree Boards, of a Tree he brought in his own Haad, on Horfeback, from Rhode-Island.—He was a loving Hufband, a tender Parent, a kind Master, a gnod Neighbour, and, what crows all, a pious Christian.
